Burt Bacharach Reschedules ASO Performance for November

Burt Bacharach and band has rescheduled his highly anticipated ASO March performance until November due to medical reasons.

The legendary hitmaker is recuperating with an excellent prognosis from recent back surgery in Los Angeles. The ASO announced today that Bacharach will return to Adelaide on **Tuesday 23 November, 8pm** at the new **Adelaide Entertainment Centre Theatre**, which officially opens in March.

Bacharach, his band and the ASO will be among the first international acts to perform in the Entertainment Centre Theatre, which with its intimate, state of the art features is being billed as Adelaide's *most contemporary and exciting live entertainment space*.

The original date of Burt Bacharach's tour did not coincide with the opening of Adelaide's newest venue, but now that the tour has been delayed it will fit in well.

"Adelaide audiences will now be able to enjoy the ASO and one of the world's most decorated popular composers in a very intimate setting with perfect sight-lines, while the sound will be pure Bacharach", said ASO Chief Executive Rainer Jozeps.

Ticket holders for the original date will be notified by the ASO about ticket transfer options for the new date, for which they will have first priority access to tickets. General public tickets will go on sale Monday 8 March, 9am through Ticketek

Burt Bacharach has written more than seventy Classic Top 40 hits with nine Number Ones and forty-eight Top Tens. He's contributed to the careers of Frank Sinatra, Barbra Streisand, Tom Jones, Dusty Springfield, Neil Diamond, Dionne Warwick, Aretha Franklin, Elvis Costello, REM, Diana Krall, Sheryl Crow, Gene Pitney, The Beatles and is Mike Myers' "Lucky Charm".
